Invitations: Individual adult member invitations are enclosed. See the Registration Form, page 6, for visitor invitation information. Member children 17 years old and younger do not require invitations.

Participation: Please consider signing up for one or more of the honors on the Registration Form.

Do you like to sing? Join our High Holy Day Singers! We hope you'll lend us your voice and spirit and take on the mitzvah of being service leaders--*Shelichay Tzibur* for our High Holy Days. No formal music training or Hebrew fluency is necessary to join in! We'll learn through recordings, on-line videos, repetition and supporting each other at rehearsals. Open to all adults, middle and high school students. There will be two insessions with Cantor Dreskin on Saturday, September 28 and Sunday, October 6. Contact Sheryl Shapiro (ruachhalev@gmail.com) for more details, questions, or to sign-up.

Rosh HaShanah Lunch: The lunch will include delicious dairy and vegan offerings prepared by congregants. See the registration form for more details. Children 12 and under are free! Reservations are required and accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until *Wednesday, September 25, 2019*. No late reservations will be accepted.

Children's Services: This year, *Rosh HaShanah Children's Services will be held at the Everett Public Boat Launch.* This short service will be followed immediately by our community *Tashlich* service for the whole community. While these song-filled children's services are targeted toward children ages 3-8 years, all are welcome. All children must be accompanied by an adult. Yom Kippur Children's Services will remain at TBO.

Yizkor Service of Remembrance: Please call the office at 425-259-7125 if you would like to add a name to your family's *Yizkor* list. All names on your family's list will be printed in the brochure. Names of immediate family members will be read aloud during the *Yizkor* Service. *Deadline for adding/changing the printed list is September 16, 2019.*

Child Care: Child care will be arranged for children six months to ten years of age, **and only for those services for which reservations have been made by Monday, September 9, 2019.**

HHD Food Bank Collection: Reusable grocery bags will be distributed at Rosh HaShanah services and donations will be accepted on Erev Yom Kippur and Yom Kippur morning. While hygiene items and non-perishable foods are always welcome, a monetary donation either as a check (made out to Volunteers of America Western Washington) or food store gift cards would also be greatly appreciated, as it allows the Food Bank to purchase items most needed. Donations: As the High Holy Days are a traditional time to make donations, we welcome donations in support of Temple Beth Or, The Wexler Family Music Fund, and/or the *Tzedakah* Fund to help organizations and individuals in need.

Special Needs: We have a wheelchair ramp at the entrance to our sanctuary and from the alley behind the building. Unfortunately, there is no wheelchair access between floors. Reservations for special needs may be made on the Registration Form and **will be held until 15 minutes prior to the beginning of each service**.

Parking: We will reserve the entire alley parking lot, excluding designated reserved parking spaces, for those with State-issued Handicapped Parking placards, and those who are unable to walk longer distances. The enclosed parking passes enable you to park in time-limited, on-street weekday parking during the High Holy Days by displaying them on your dashboard. Each pass is dated and can only be used on that date. **Please note that due to construction along the alley, street parking will be very crowded. Expect to have to park further from the Temple this year.**

Jewish Time

We live in many "time zones" as Jews. We live in Jewish Time as we mark this coming year of 5780. We live in American Time as students begin the school year. We live in Natural Time as we witness the transition to fall with cooler temperatures, shorter days, and the turning of leaves.

Jewish thinkers believe there is something significant about time in our tradition. Our Sages included the phrase *l'dor v'dor* (from generation to generation) in our daily worship. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel described Shabbat as a "sanctuary in time." Yosef Haim Yerushalmi, in the preeminent work in the world of Jewish studies, *Zakhor*: Jewish History and Jewish Memory, argues that Judaism is ahistorical. Judaism is philosophy, spirituality, and mysticism. The enduring aspects of Judaism is not the history, rather the living.

Just as we live in many "time zones" as Jews, there are many ways of defining time in our tradition too. This year, through varied congregational opportunities, we will focus on the theme: *Kol Dorot* which means in Hebrew either "all generations" or "the voice of generations." Through our experiences and learning, together we will explore the relationship between past, present, and future in our lives, at our synagogue, and in our society. To help bring together the beautiful diversity of generations that comprise *all the generations* at Beth Or, we will enjoy special time this year in a multi-generation setting beginning with *Tashlich* at the Everett Boat Launch and our Sukkot Celebration at the Temple.

We begin our High Holy Days season as we begin our Hebrew month of Elul and we focus on *teshuvah*: repentance and return (another Hebrew phrase with multiple meanings). I invite you to bring your attention to the varied ways you experience time. Pay particular consideration to the relationship between past, present, and future in your life.

Elul Meditations:

How have you been shaped by the past year? How may the year that has past affect my year to come? How should looking towards the future affect my current life and choices?
