#### **General Information**

Zoom links: Security for all of our programming is a priority. You must pre-register to receive some of the Zoom links, as they will be for Zoom Webinar and will not be publicly shared. There won't be the opportunity to receive last minute links! Non-members, including family not living with members, must also register to receive Zoom links. There will be no cost for non-members at our High Holy Days (HHD) this year.

A quick explanation of the different types of Zoom we will be using: Zoom Pro (which we have been using) is ideal for hosting interactive sessions; Zoom Webinar is like a virtual auditorium, more suited for larger groups that are less interactive.

**Prayer books:** There are multiple ways to obtain the Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur HHD prayer books during the HHD season.

- Books for purchase:
  - Mishkan Hanefesh is available as two books (Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur) on Amazon for Kindle. The Kindle app is free and available for use on any computer or tablet.

- **FlipBooks**: The two prayer books are available as flipbooks free of charge online. This method of using the prayer books **works best if you have two devices**, as the flipbooks obscure part of the screen when trying to use them and viewing the service at the same time. **HHD Bulletins:** In September you will be receiving a HHD Master Bulletin by email which will cover the entire HHD period.

**High Holy Days Singers:** The HHD singers have been working with Cantor Dreskin to prepare music for you to enjoy during HHD services. Listen for their singing during the High Holy Days observances.

*Tashlich*: Unfortunately, we cannot safely have a communal *Tashlich* service this year. You will be receiving information to help you create your own *Tashlich* observance, if you wish to do so.

**HHD Food Bank Drive:** This year as we are unable to be together in person a monetary donation either as a check made out to Volunteers of America Western Washington (VAWW), or grocery store gift cards sent directly to VAWW would be greatly appreciated. #### **Creating Deep Connections in a Virtual World; Soul Work**

August 20, 2020, Time: 7:00pm

For 35 years I believed I had a food problem. For 20 years I thought I had a work problem and for 19 years I thought I had relationship problems. However, what I have come to realize is that each of these things is not a problem. They were symptoms of a bigger issue. I had a spiritual practice problem. I had succumbed to a life that looked nothing like I thought it would be, and most of it because of my own best thinking. By throwing everything I thought I knew away and gathering up all that I had learned, I began to develop a new way of being. For this class I will share what I have learned from my experience so far and together we will share wisdom and insights we each bring to our spiritual practice.

**Amy Paquette**, Presenter: Amy is the proud mother of Adina Paquette and wife to Dan Paquette (fun TBO guy!). When Amy isn't finding funding for the Starlight Children's Foundation, she is at home thinking about how to revolutionize some of the world's most significant issues. How much am I responsible for? How far does my reach extend? When can I say enough? It all sounds great, but what are the limits?

**Rabbi David Fine**, Presenter: While he rarely gets to use the title, David Fine is rabbi emeritus of Temple Beth Or, having served from 1993-1998 as our congregation's first rabbi. He joined the staff of the Union for Reform Judaism in 1996, working with smaller congregations, their rabbis, lay leaders, and boards. He also advises congregations on mergers and collaborative ventures, using design thinking and appreciative ways of creating a stronger future. Rabbi Fine was part of the core team that brought URJ Camp Kalsman to fruition and has been an active member of the Camp Commission and faculty since its inception. He relishes every opportunity to teach, to learn, and find meaning in relationship with others.
