A New Year of Learning and Growing Together

Iudaism has endured for thousands of years because of its focus on the relationship between the past, present, and future. Jewish continuity is defined by static practices throughout history and an openness to adaptation. It is an openness to change and influence that has allowed for ancient tradition to remain relevant in our lives. Our Passover Haggadah teaches: "b'kol dor vador chayav lirot et etzmo" in every generation we are obligated to see ourselves [in our tradition]. We are called upon to engage with our tradition and make it our own.

This year, our Beth Or community will engage in learning and experiences around the theme of *Kol Dorot* which can be translated from Hebrew as either "all generations" or "the voice of generations." The theme will help us focus as a community on building bridges between different generations at Temple Beth Or. This was a community goal that the congregation

shared loud and clear as a part of the rabbinic search process that brought me to Beth Or.

Through our Kol Dorot theme, our Beth Or community will honor the unique voices of all generations that comprise our sacred community. This year we will focus on programming that brings us together as a multigeneration community. In addition, through learning and intentional interactions, we will explore how different generations have found meaning in ancient Jewish practice and examine how different generations have transformed Jewish practice to ensure relevance.

In the spirit of *Kol Dorot*, I hope you can join us on **Sunday, October 13**, for our Multi-Generational Sukkot Celebration (see details on front page). This Sukkot we're celebrating at Beth Or with a variety of offerings with the hope of bringing together our diverse, multi-



generational community. Join us for as many of the offerings that speak to you!



Natalia oversees volunteer operations and AmeriCorps programming for Resettlement, Asylum and Integration at the International Rescue Committee, Inc. She joined the IRC in August 2010 and earlier this year was deployed to Arizona to coordinate efforts helping asylum seeking families.

The IRC provides opportunities for refugees, asylum seekers, victims of human trafficking, survivors of torture, and other immigrants to thrive in America. The IRC works with government bodies and local volunteers to help these individuals translate their past experiences into assets that are valuable to their new communities. In Seattle and other offices across the country, the IRC helps them to rebuild their lives.

Nus from the Governing Board

In addition to regular monthly business, the Governing Board is undergoing a review of all policies currently in the record. Many are several years old. This review, which is anticipated to take several months, will determine which policies are no longer current, which need to be modified, and which can be reaffirmed. In some cases this will result in new policies that will reflect our current practice and culture. These policies will be available for review as they become available soon.

At the September Governing Board meeting the following business occurred and information shared:

- 1. Review of policies: Membership Dues and Capital Assessment. Policy was refined.
- 2. The ad hoc art committee was established to make recommendations for art placement. Suggestions were presented.
- 3. Asbestos mitigation bids on the duplex are still pending.
- 4. The Finance Committee announced that we received preliminary approval for a grant to increase security by fencing part of the property.
- 5. The Governing Board determined that we need both a Fundraising Committee and a central coordinator for all activities.
- 6. Security will become a line item in the budget to better reflect our security-related expenses, rather than be "hidden" in other line items.

The Nominating Committee for the 2020 Governing Board has been set! Members include: Sonia Siegel Vexler, chair, Jennifer Cail, Debbie Halliday, and Dan Paquette. The Committee is looking for members to serve on the Board. Consider nominating yourself or someone in the congregation. If you have questions please contact one of us.
