Summer Journeys

June is here and so is the summer travel season! Do you have travel plans this summer? Whether you are going near or far, staying at a resort or in a rustic cabin, it is an opportunity to embrace an important Jewish value: self-discovery.

God's call to our patriarch Abraham established the centrality of a journey of selfdiscovery in our tradition. Abraham's journey, which is essentially the start of our journey as a Jewish people, begins with God's call: "Lech lecha." We typically translate this command as "go forth," but the Hebrew embodies a journey of self-discovery. "Lech lecha" literally means, "go to yourself."

For those of you who don't know already, I love to travel. My first time away from home was to attend Jewish summer camp in the Canadian San Juan Islands (before URJ Camp Kalsman was built). My first time traveling outside of North America was to the Czech Republic and Israel on a Iewish heritage tour as a teen. As much as I learned about Jewish tradition and being a part of Jewish community through these immersive experiences, my biggest takeaway from

summers spent far from home as an adolescent was self-confidence. This dynamic of travel still holds true for me today as an adult. When I travel and leave my typical routine I find I have more headspace to think about my life back at home and my priorities there. Going away allows me to go deeper inside myself.

This July, I am thrilled that my travel plans include spending a week up at URJ Camp Kalsman in Arlington (July 21-28). I want to thank you, my Temple Beth Or community, for supporting my time away from the Temple so I can support our students and PNW youth as they learn, grow, and find themselves at camp. While my time at Kalsman is primarily a time for me to give back, I know that being away in this special setting will be transformative for my rabbinate and me. I'm looking forward to working collaboratively with local Reform rabbis, cantors, and educators and being inspired by the camp faculty, the next generation of Jewish leadership, who are primarily in their late teens and twenties.

When we are together at Temple Beth Or this summer,



I would like to suggest a way we can all support the Jewish value of self-discovery. When we find ourselves talking about vacation or summer camp over sweet treats at the *Oneg*, instead of asking "How was your trip?" or "How was camp?" let's ask "What did you learn about yourself while you were away?"

L'dor V'dor Membership

The Membership Committee has been working on a new "*L'dor V'dor* Member Policy" that has been approved by the Board. We want to share the new policy with all our TBO Community: "Temple Beth Or is committed to the continuation of Jewish life in Snohomish County, and in the spirit of *l'dor v'dor* (generation to generation) we want to honor the next generation of Beth Or families. Therefore, when a child of a current Beth Or member seeks to join they will be offered the opportunity to waive their dues for the first year of membership under this *L'dor V'dor* Membership Policy." Applicants will still follow the normal application process even though no dues commitment is expected for the first year. At the end of the one-year period they would continue as a dues-paying member per existing dues policies.We look forward to welcoming more "*L'dor V'dor*" members. Tzedakah Fund

At its last meeting the Social Action Committee (SAC) voted to make the following donations from the Temple Beth Or Tzedakah Fund:

- \$500 to the Northwest Immigrants Rights Program: This donation will help the organization with its mission to promote justice by defending and advancing the rights of immigrants through direct legal services, systemic advocacy, and community education.
- \$500 to the Anti-Defamation League Pacific Northwest (ADL -PNW): For over 70 years, the ADL-PNW has worked to build a better world. This donation will help them with their current efforts to fight anti-Semitism and to protect our civil rights.

Nus from the Special Membership Meeting

There were approximately 50 people in attendance at the Special Membership Meeting held on April 28. The meeting included much discussion and some clarifying questions related to the disposition of the duplex on the north end of our property. The unanimous vote was to tear the building down as soon as practicable.

Bylaws Update

A task force made up of Tim Douglass, Julie Mackoff, Heidi Piel, Dan Paquette, Sandy Voit and Melanie Field has been revisiting the TBO Bylaws. The team has drafted a proposed revised set. The current Bylaws from September 2016 (as well as the proposed revised Bylaws) require that the members of the congregation vote to approve any amendments to the existing Bylaws. This vote will occur at the June 23 membership meeting. Please join us to learn more about the proposed revisions, to ask questions, and then to vote whether or not to approve the proposed revisions.

Proposed revisions include streamlining the Bylaws by removing policy and procedural language. The Board structure has been slightly modified. Many other modest changes are proposed. We hope that these simpler Bylaws will hold up a bit longer and require less revising. A complete set of the proposed changes will be included in the meeting packet. If you have questions feel free to contact any of the members of the Bylaws task force listed above.
