Women of the Wall

The space of the Temple Mount has looked very different throughout our people's history. It is a physical symbol of change and continuity among our Jewish People. The ancient Temple in Jerusalem was a place of pilgrimage, gathering, and worship through sacrifice. Today, we too make sacred journeys to Jerusalem and gather at the *Kotel. Kotel* simply means 'wall' in Hebrew, referencing the last remnant of the Temple, a giant retaining wall. We are drawn to this place where our People have gathered for thousands of years to worship. But while the *Kotel* is the principal symbol of Jewish peoplehood and sovereignty, Israeli authorities do not allow all Jews to express themselves freely through prayer at this most sacred site.

Many of you are already familiar with the work of Women of the Wall. This group of Jewish women from Israel and around the world, representing all denominations and political spectrums, strive to achieve the right for women to wear tallit and teffilin, pray, and read from the Torah collectively and out loud at the *Kotel*. Over the past 30 years the group has made strides through legal activism and nonviolent protest to achieve the right for women to wear ritual garments and pray as a collective. But it still remains illegal for women to read from the Torah at the Kotel.

I'm incredibly proud that our 2019 Board of Trustees voted unanimously to partner with Women of the Wall and offer our community's strength to their efforts. This Shavuot (May 28, 2020), the holiday on which the Jewish people received the Torah, Women of the Wall is organizing a march to the *Kotel* and we at Temple Beth Or will participate in a special way. Women will march holding



Torah mantles as a symbol of what women have been denied. Our Board has gifted our community's Torah mantles that we no longer use. Our sacred objects like prayer books, Torah scrolls, and Torah mantles are traditionally buried after deemed non-functioning. Our mantles will be respectfully retired in Israel, eternally connecting our Snohomish county Jewish community to our People's most sacred place, Jerusalem.

Why vote?



Five years ago, Reform Jews in the state of Washington cast 210 votes in the World Zionist Congress election. We can do better. We for the Reform/ARZA slate (number two on the ballot), is a vote for equality, pluralism

must do better if we want our Reform Jewish values to be represented in Israel. A vote and democracy.

There are 16 URI congregations in Washington with a combined membership of 4088 households. Only 5.14% of those households voted in the last election and still, more than \$20 million were distributed to Reform causes in the past five years, new Reform synagogues were established in Israel and leaders were elected who were able to influence Israeli policy and procedure. Successful collaborations with Israeli political parties were forged to influence Israeli society in matters of conversion, marriage and divorce, religious pluralism, gender rights and combatting racism.

Imagine what we can do it we triple or quadruple the vote in every state!

Voting in the World Zionist Election is the only way that American Jews can weigh in democratically about issues in Israel. The more votes for the Reform/ARZA slate, the more delegates we can send to the congress this Fall.

At the **February Governing Board** meeting the following business occurred and information was shared:

- 1. Emergency training is now scheduled: Stop the Bleed was held on February 16; AED and CPR to be held on March 1. Congregants are invited by RSVP ONLY to the AED/CPR class for \$40 charge.
- 2. Benchmarking started on February 18. Ends March 17.
- 3. Melanie and Vicky will work on a policy regarding the distribution of directories.
- 4. We will begin the search for a Religious School principal soon, looking outside the congregation.
- 5. There was continuing discussion regarding building security.
- 6. New silent alarms have been installed in various places around the building.
- 7. We will investigate putting a security screen downstairs.
- 8. The annual budget process will begin next month...

Of note: Neil Fishman has generously offered to upgrade our security system to a network based system and will donate all the hardware. This will not only enhance our security system, but will also allow us to stream services for those unable to come to the Temple. Thank you, Neil!

TBO Leadership Attends Scheidt Seminar

Each year the URI hosts a leadership development program underwritten by the Scheidt family for Presidents and Presidents-Elect. In February, Vicky Romero and Melanie Field attended the Scheidt Seminar in California. For four days they immersed themselves in sessions aimed at helping to improve our synagogue community. Topics included finances and philanthropy, forming Sacred Partnerships, social action programming, becoming more inclusive, and many others. Along with approximately 70 other congregational Presidents and Presidents-Elect, Vicky and Melanie participated in workshops, Shabbat services and Torah study that ran from 7:00 am to after 10:00 pm most days - it was exhausting and overwhelming! Services were lead by Rabbi Rick Jacobs, President of the URJ and Cantor Rosalie Will, close friend and colleague of our own beloved Ellen Dreskin.
