
Laila Lowery Is Becoming A Bat Mitzvah

Demographic Trends

Do you know the following demographic trends in North American Jewish Life?

Interfaith/intermarried couples and families:

Since 2000, 71% of non-Orthodox Jewish marriages in the United States have been interfaith. Overall, the Jewish rate of intermarriage in the US has exceeded 50%. (Source: Pew)

• Jews with disabilities:

Jews with disabilities account for 20% of our community. (Source: Ruderman Foundation)

• Jews of color and multiracial families:

At least 12-15% of Jews in the United States identify as Jews of color of African, Latinx, Asian or mixed-race descent (Source: Counting Inconsistencies). Less than 10% of US Jews are of Mizrahi or of Sephardic heritage. (Source: Bechol Lashon)

LGBTQIA+ Jews (Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and/or queer Jews):

Approximately 10% of North American Jewry identifies as part of the LGBTQIA+ community, and that doesn't count those who do not openly identify. (Source: Multiple)

COVID-19 Update

The Combined COVID-19 Task Force met on June 8. After a long conversation we have amended the following guidelines:

- Eating is permitted outside at Temple events
- Boosters will be required for everyone ≥ 5 yrs. at Temple sponsored events and services after September 1
- Current health and safety protocols will be in place during the High Holy Days (unless there are major changes in the course of the pandemic)
- Second boosters are recommended for all who are eligible, but not required at this time

Case counts are still higher than allowed for *onegs* and optional masking at the time of writing (June 16). However, the trend is in the right direction. We remain hopeful that case counts will continue to drop to allow us to return to optional masking and *onegs*. Decisions regarding *onegs* and masking are based on case counts provided on Mondays by the Snohomish Health District. Semi-Annual Membership Meeting News

During the Semi-Annual Membership Meeting on June 12, 2022 the following happened:

- 1. Melanie Field opened the meeting and Rabbi Kort led an opening prayer.
- 2. The congregation approved the minutes from the December Semi-Annual Membership Meeting.
- 3. James Feinberg reviewed the estimated end of year Finance Report to the congregation.
- 4. James Feinberg presented the proposed budget for the 2022-23 fiscal year. The congregation voted to approve the budget.
- 5. Rachel Maxwell shared the findings from her Financial Feasibility Study.
- 6. Melanie Field gave an update on the Capital Campaign.
- 7. Members spent 15 minutes in breakout rooms processing the presented information.
- 8. JonaRose Feinberg reviewed the instructions for electronic voting.
- 9. Bob Goodmark gave an update on the South Lot property.
- 10. Rabbi Kort shared information about High Holy Days planning. She invited all to participate in the upcoming planning meeting.
- 11. Melanie Field spoke about the rebooting of the *oneg* and community greeter programs now being coordinated by Janet Karr.
- 12. Amber Waldbaum shared information about the new teen/confirmation program. She invited everyone who is interested to attend the informational meeting.
- 13. Julie Mackoff gave an update on our efforts to support a Ukrainian family.
- 14. Melanie Field shared volunteer opportunities and highlights from the President's Report.
- 15. Melanie Field reminded the congregation about upcoming key dates and activities including: outdoor multi-generational services on July 30 and August 20, the Tisha B'Av experience on Sunday, August 7, the TBO Summer BBQ on August 28, and the Capital Campaign Kick-off on September 10.

Leadership News

During the Governing Board Meeting on June 12, 2022 the Board did the following:

- 1. Approved the updated minutes from the May 15 meeting, including the addition of the missing motioners/seconders.
- 2. Confirmed new October Board meeting date of October 13, 7:00 pm.
- 3. Signed up for greeter duties using the Shabbat Tracker.
- 4. Reviewed Sarah Davis' August schedule (vacation).
- 5. Discussed the December meetings schedule and reset meeting dates.
- 6. Reviewed the logistics for the June 12 congregational meeting.
- 7. Considered the latest recommendations from the Combined COVID-19 Task Force. The Board approved recommendations that allowed for outdoor eating and required all eligible to have one booster by September 1, including younger kids who are both in and not in our Religious School.
- 8. Discussed and reaffirmed protocol for unregistered non-member guests who show up at TBO events.
- 9. Reviewed the March financial reports.
- 10. Heard highlights from Committee/Task Force Reports including: transition to new chair for Combined COVID-19 - Adam Goldstein, Kathie Roon becoming the ORacle editor, first HHD planning meeting set for June 22, plans for a summer BBQ on August 28, Ellis stepping down as R&R chair, and the security grant application being filed.
- 11. Heard highlights of the President's Report, including that Janet Karr got the oneg program rebooted with sign up requested by June 15, the chuppah has been rented out following the updated policy, and Ellis Engbar has volunteered to serve as Yom Kippur coordinator.

Capital Campaign Vote Results

The results are in: 95% of voters supported moving forward with the capital campaign! Now that we have affirmed congregational support, we are ready to move on to the next steps. The capital campaign will launch this fall, with a kickoff event on September 10. At the same time we will be working with the architect to create construction drawings and will be getting bids from builders.
